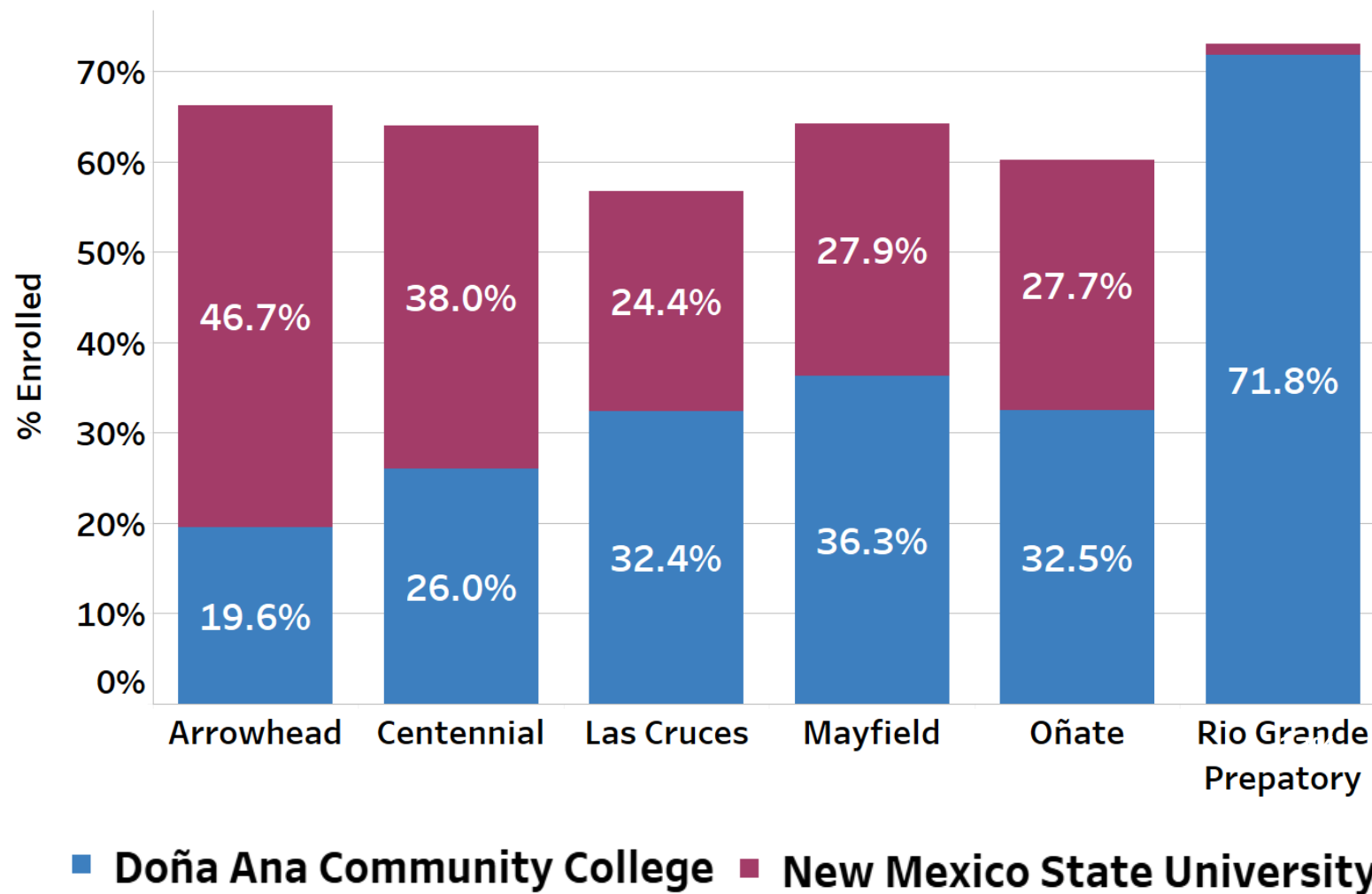
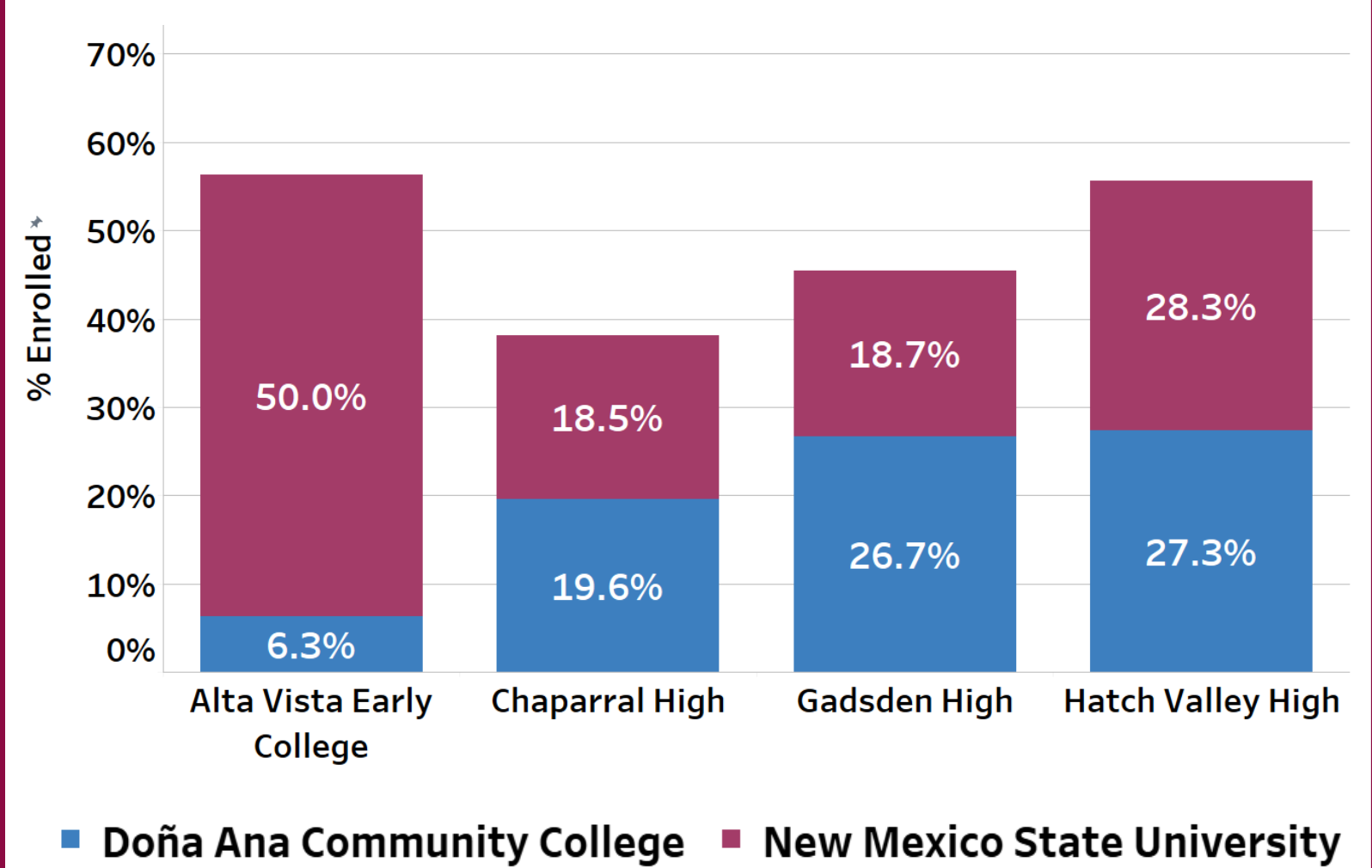

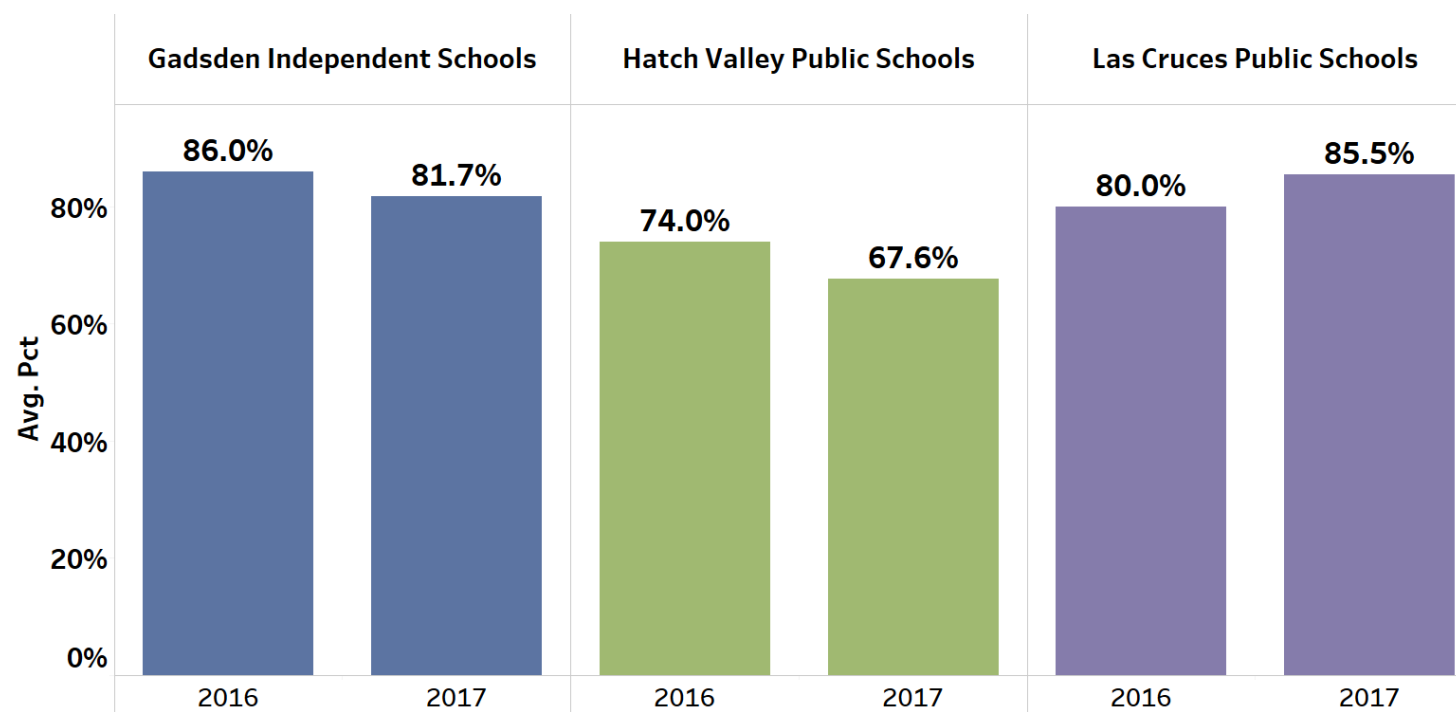
1st-time Freshmen at NMSU and DACC as a percentage of the senior class size, **Las Cruces Public Schools**, 2016

High school graduation rates in Doña Ana County, 2016 and 2017



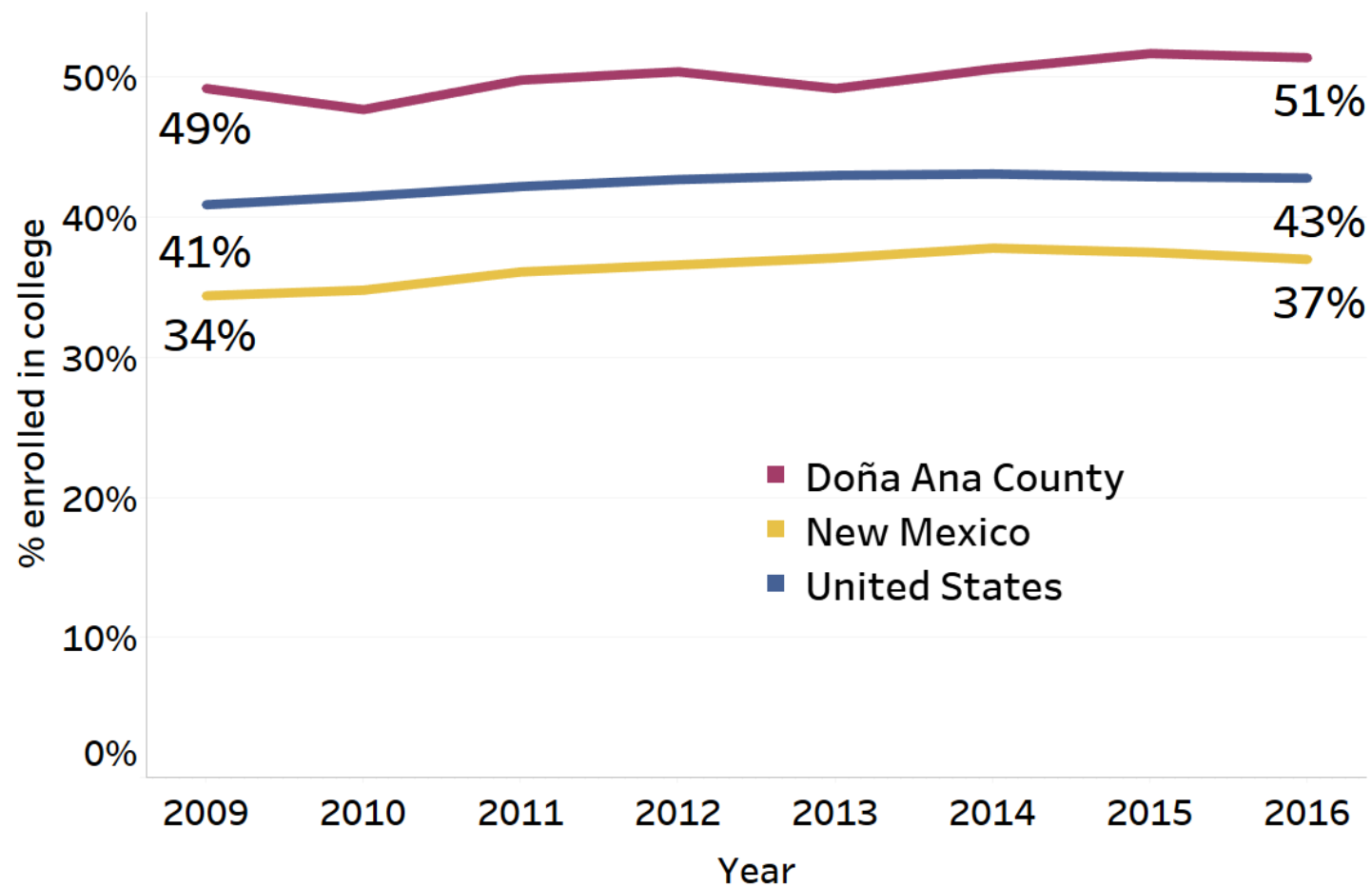
Population with a Bachelor's Degree or Higher in Doña Ana County



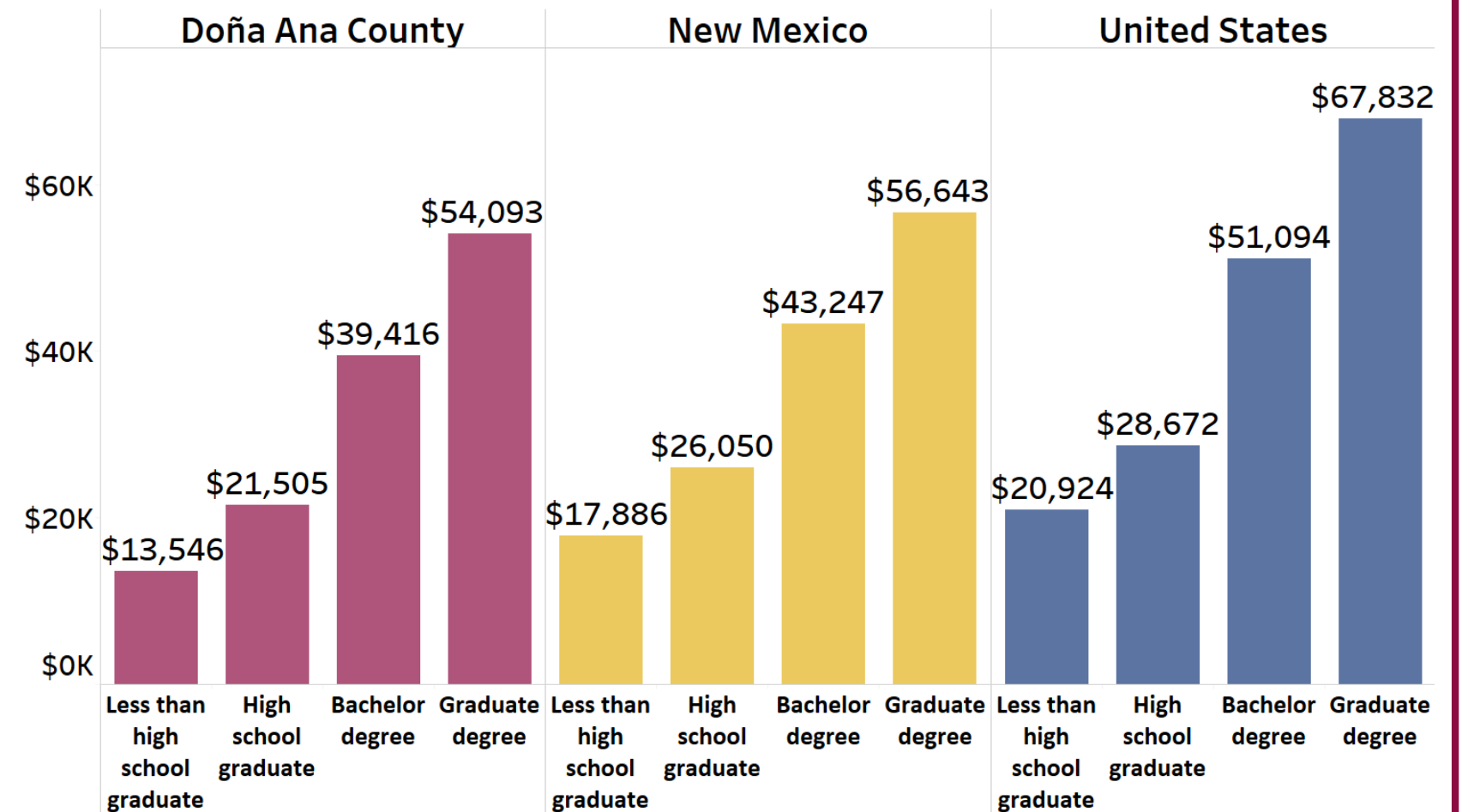
