



The lack of opportunities between disadvantaged children and their peers to education and other resources needed to be successful.





"By age 3, children with college-educated parents or primary caregivers had vocabularies 2 to 3 times larger than those whose parents had not completed high school."



3rd Grade Reading Proficiency

Reading at grade level is one of the strongest predictors of future academic success, with data showing the association between gaps in early literacy and persistent achievement gaps.


Third-grade reading proficiency in Gadsden Public Schools remains one of the highest proficiency rates in the state. Students from Las Cruces and Hatch remain at or just below state proficiency levels.

Percentage of 3rd Grade Students Proficient in Reading Doña Ana County School Districts and New Mexico, (PARCC) FY 16-19




Percentage of 3rd Graders Proficient in Reading, LCPS, 2019



Percentage of 3rd Graders Proficient in Reading, by School in LCPS, 2019





Percentage of economically disadvantaged students in LCPS elementary schools, 2019





% of Students with Free or Reduced Price Lunch, 2021


Percentage of 3rd Graders Proficient in Reading in Doña Ana County, Students with Disabilities, 2019


Students Supported in Healthy Schools



Equitable Access to Higher Education & Career Opportunities

- <u>Dual Credit, Early College High</u> <u>Schools, and CTE Courses</u> can help to establish academic momentum—a foundation for early college and career success.

What are Early College High Schools?

ECHS simultaneously offer a high school diploma and a college-level credential and/or degree.

- Other students underrepresented in higher education





- The statewide total college remediation rate is around **39.3%** for recent NM high school graduates. (2018)


Doña Ana County High School Graduation Rates, by District, Compared to State and National Rates:







Top 5 Careers Sought by Job Candidates, Doña Ana County, Nov 2021






