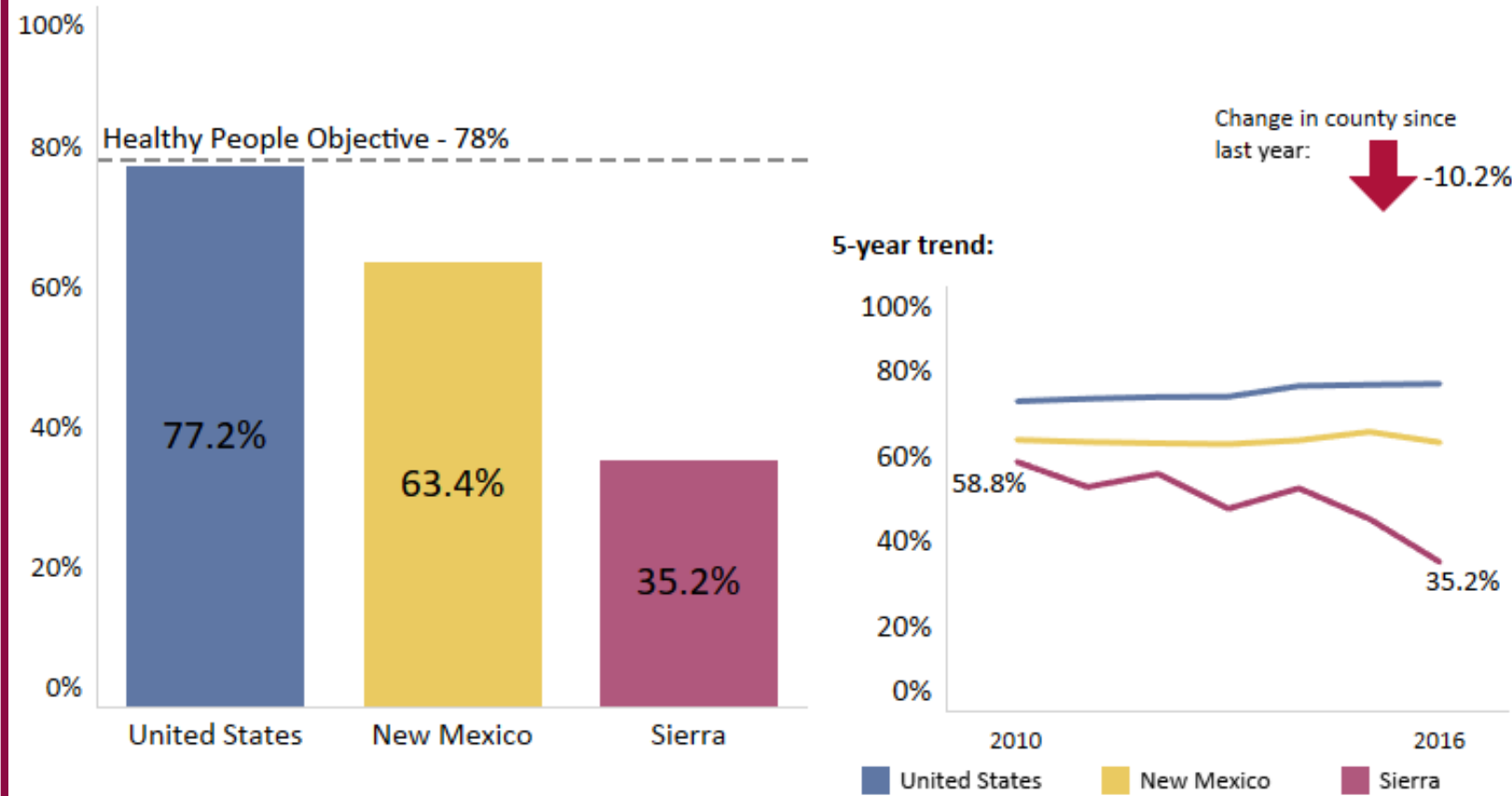
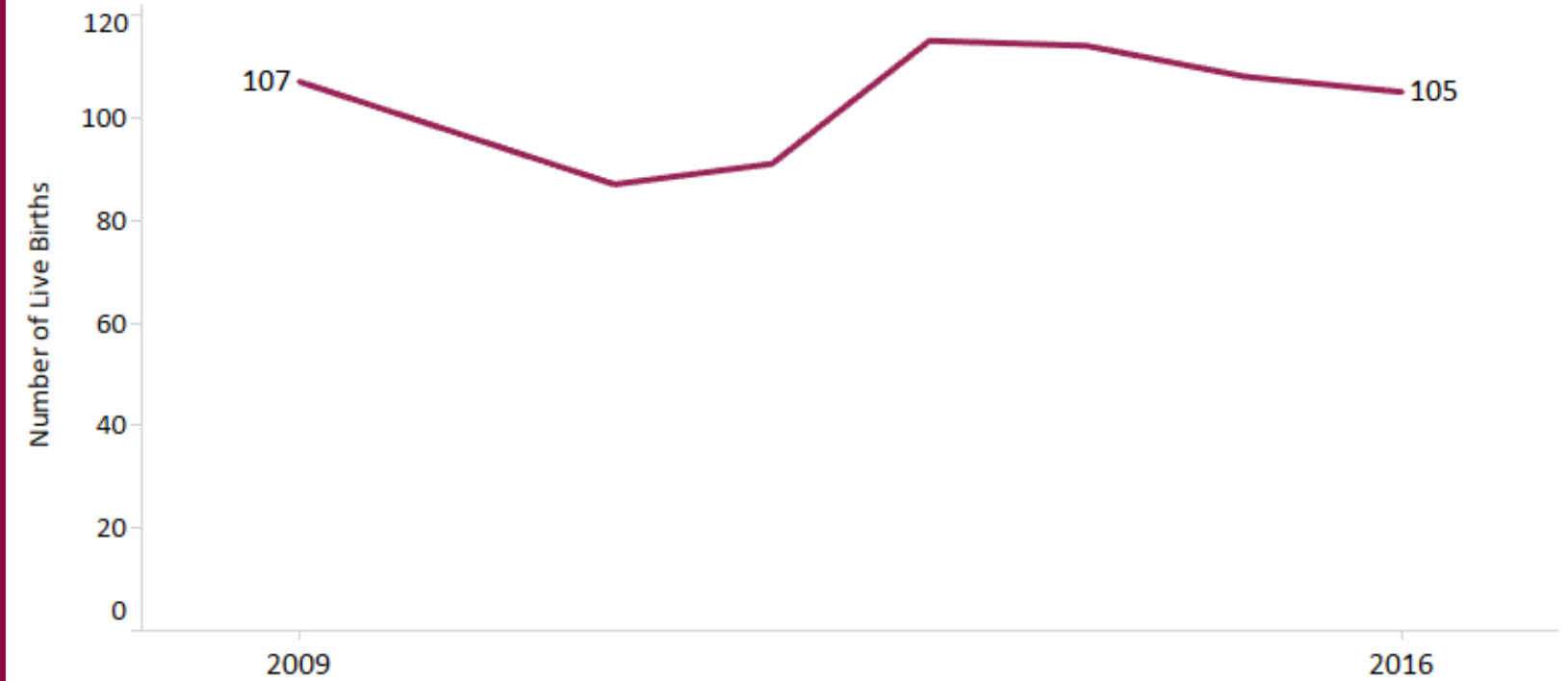

Percent of mothers who received prenatal care, 2016

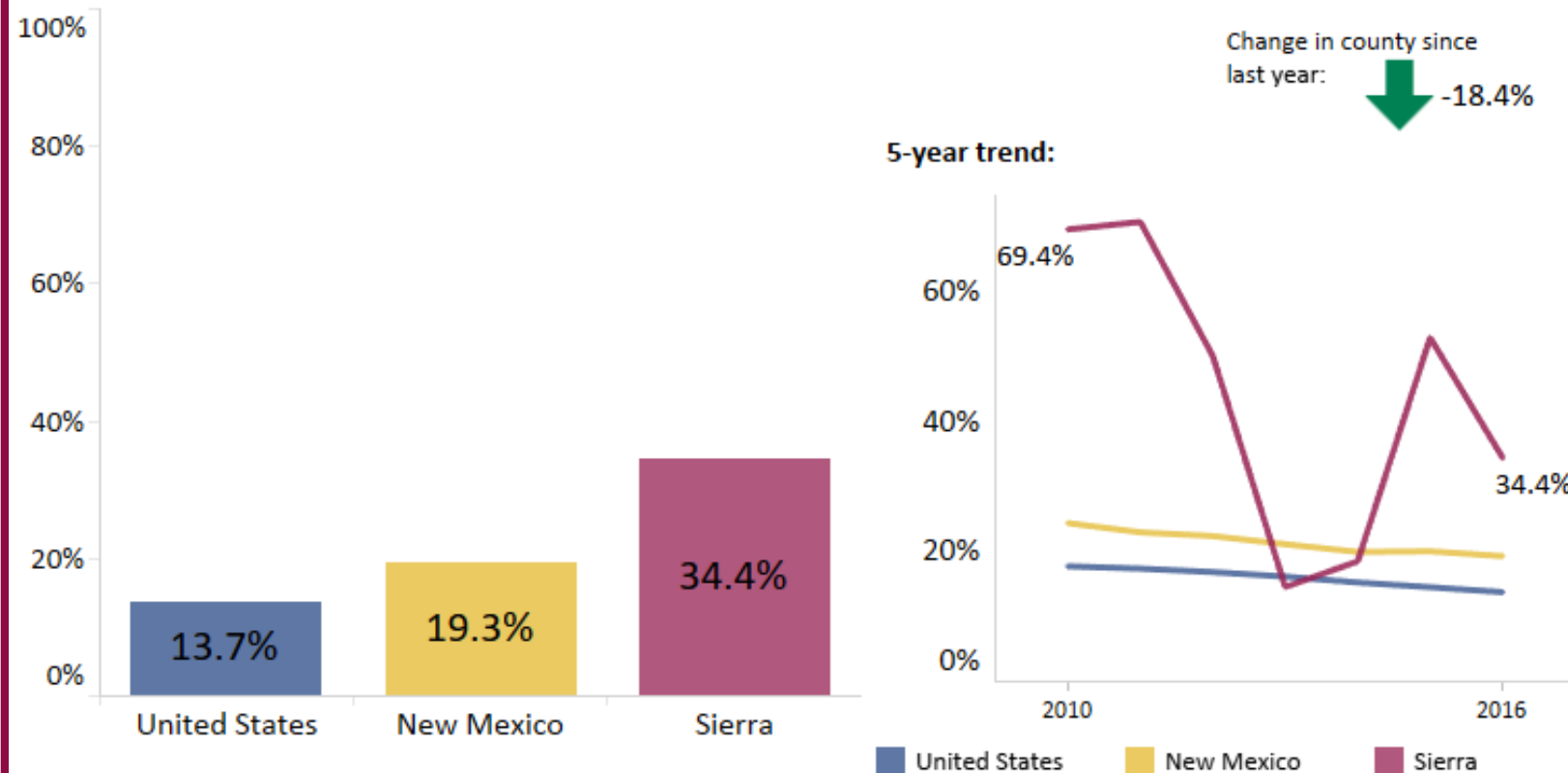


Birth Rate in Sierra County, 2009-2016

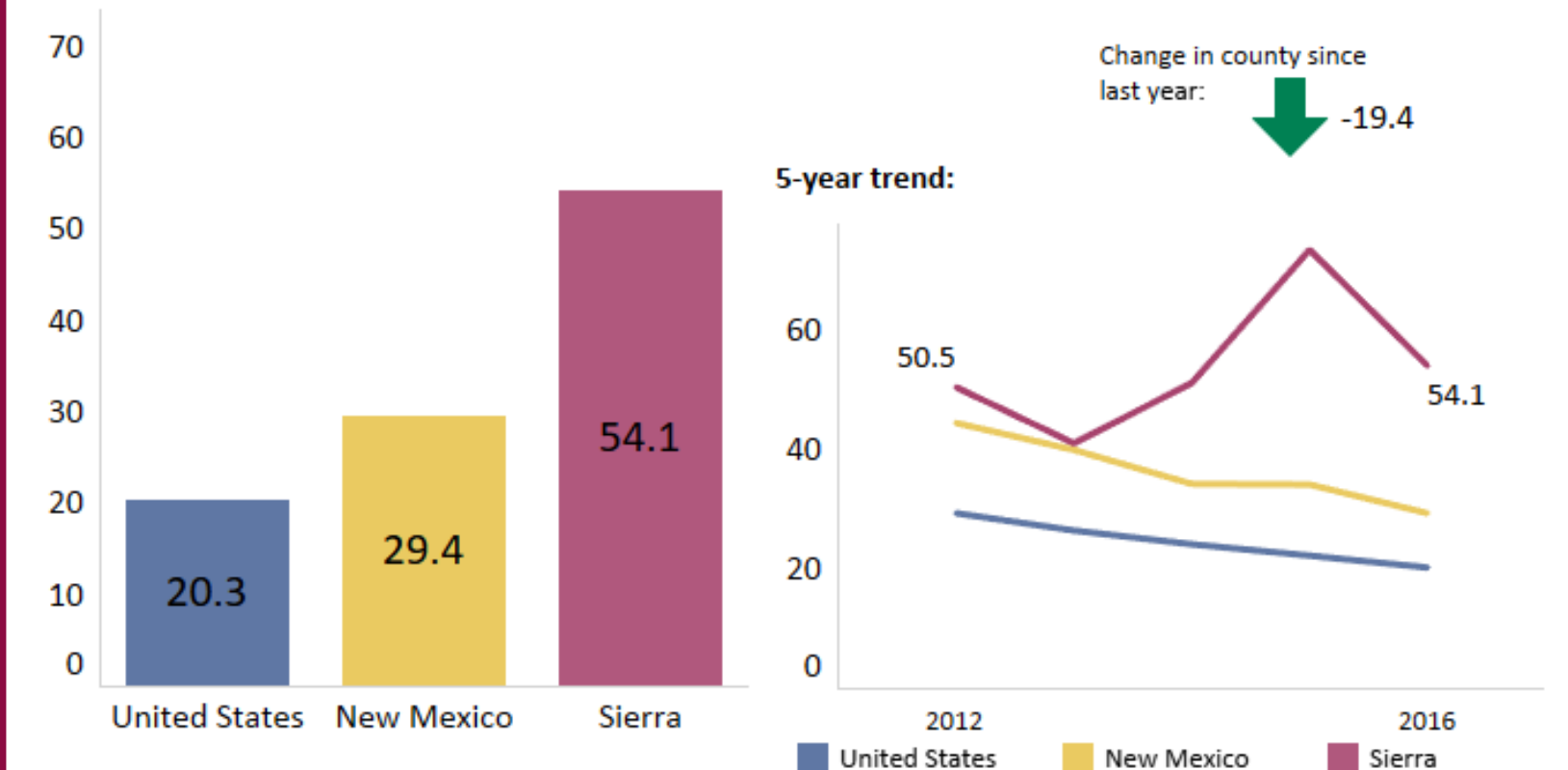


25.8% of mothers 15 to 50 who gave birth in the past 12 months live below 100% of the poverty line in Sierra

Number of births per 1,000 female teens ages 15-19, 2016

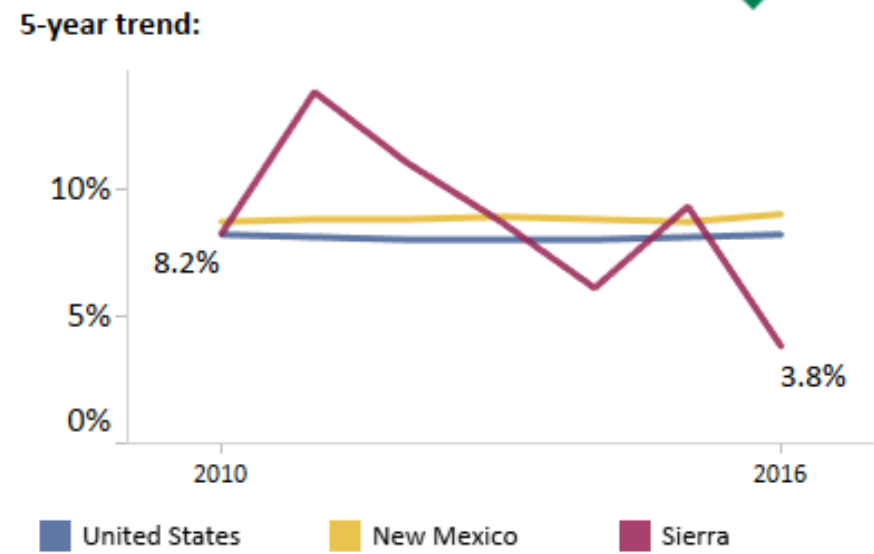
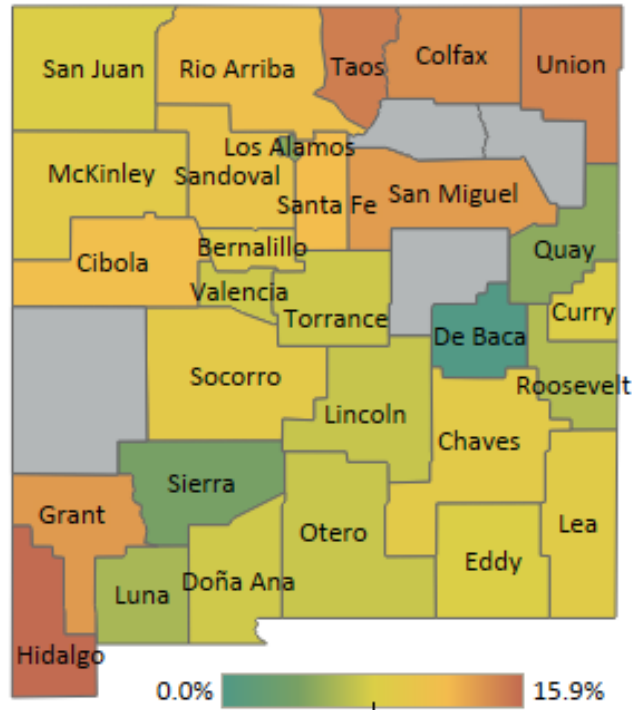

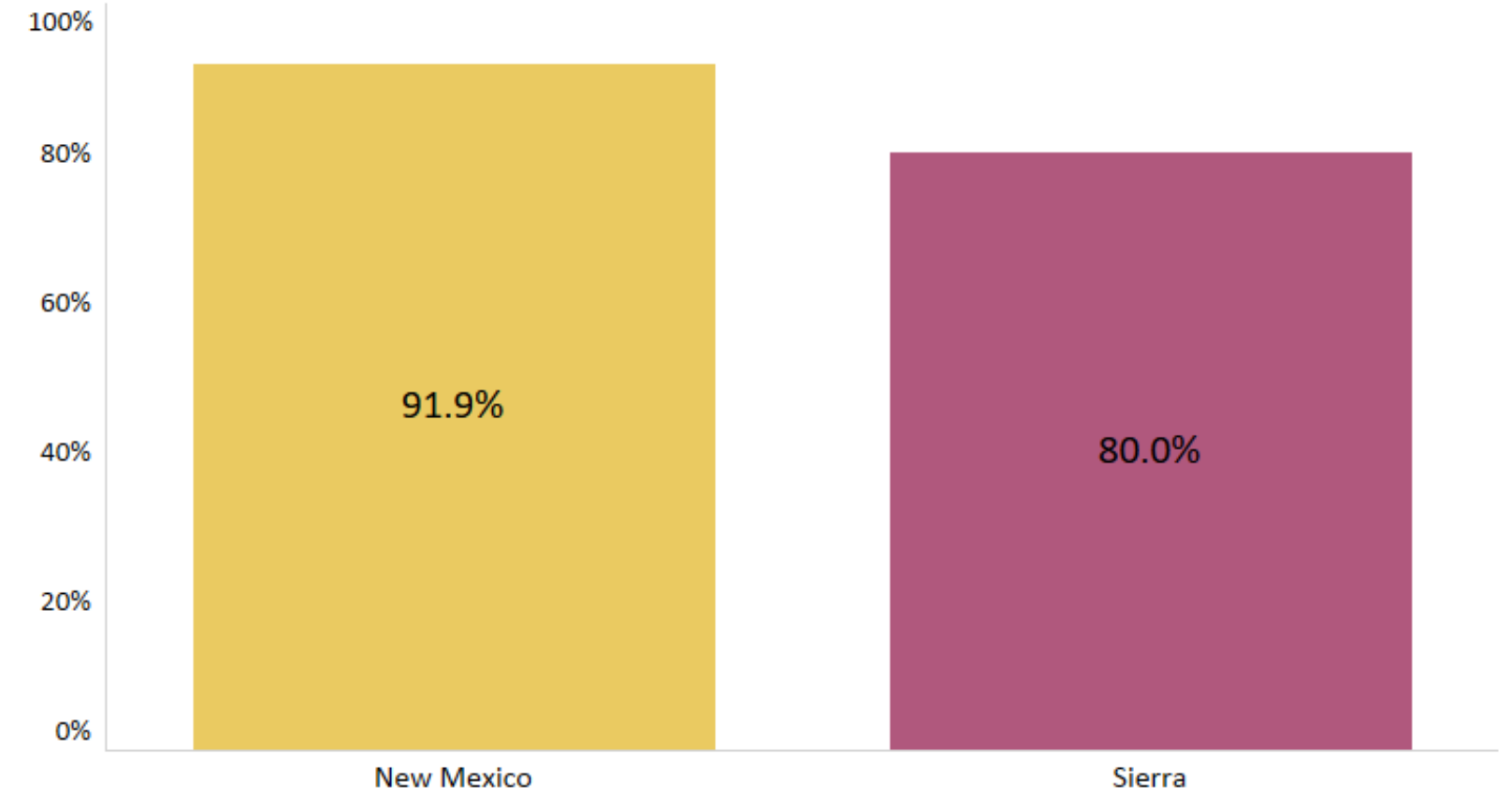

Percent of babies with low or very low birthweight, 2016

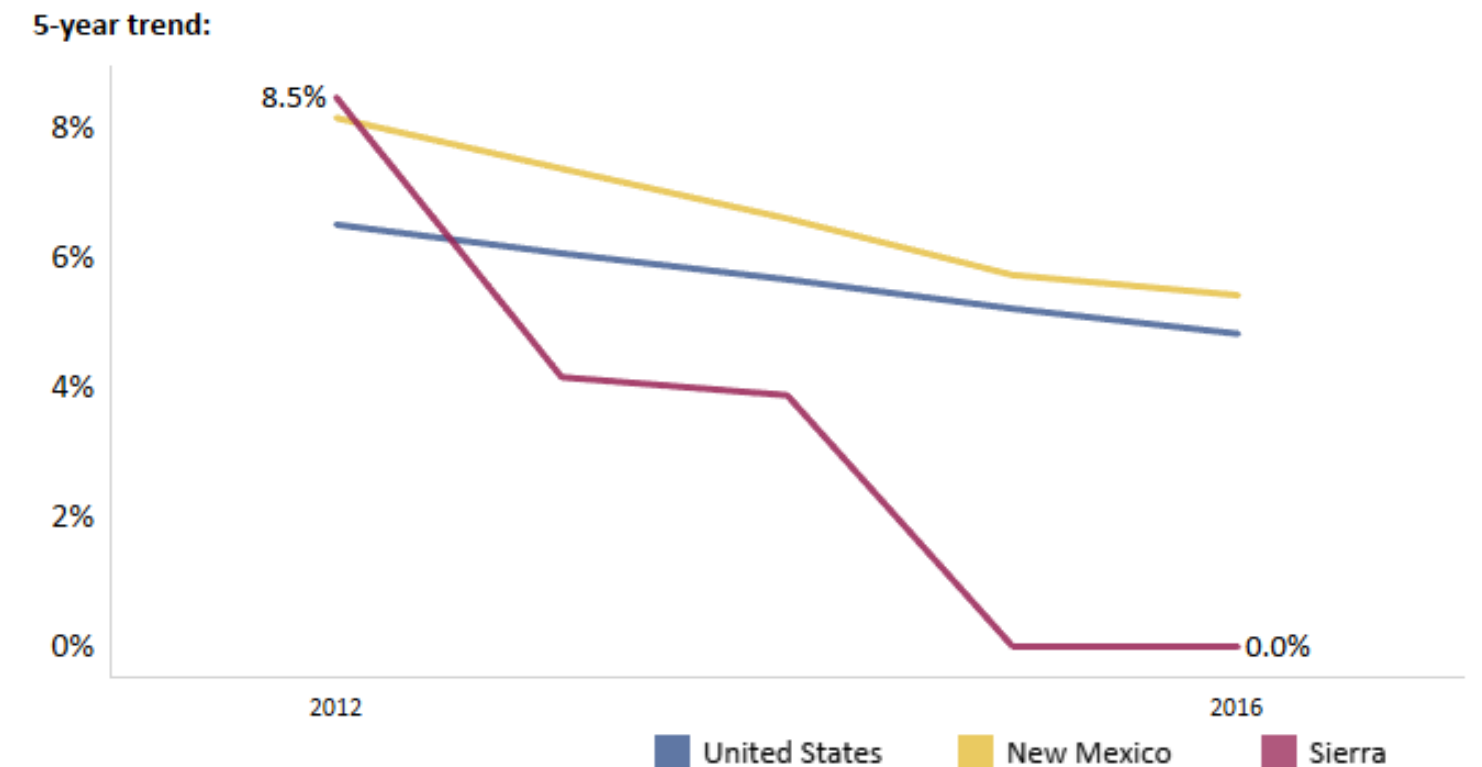
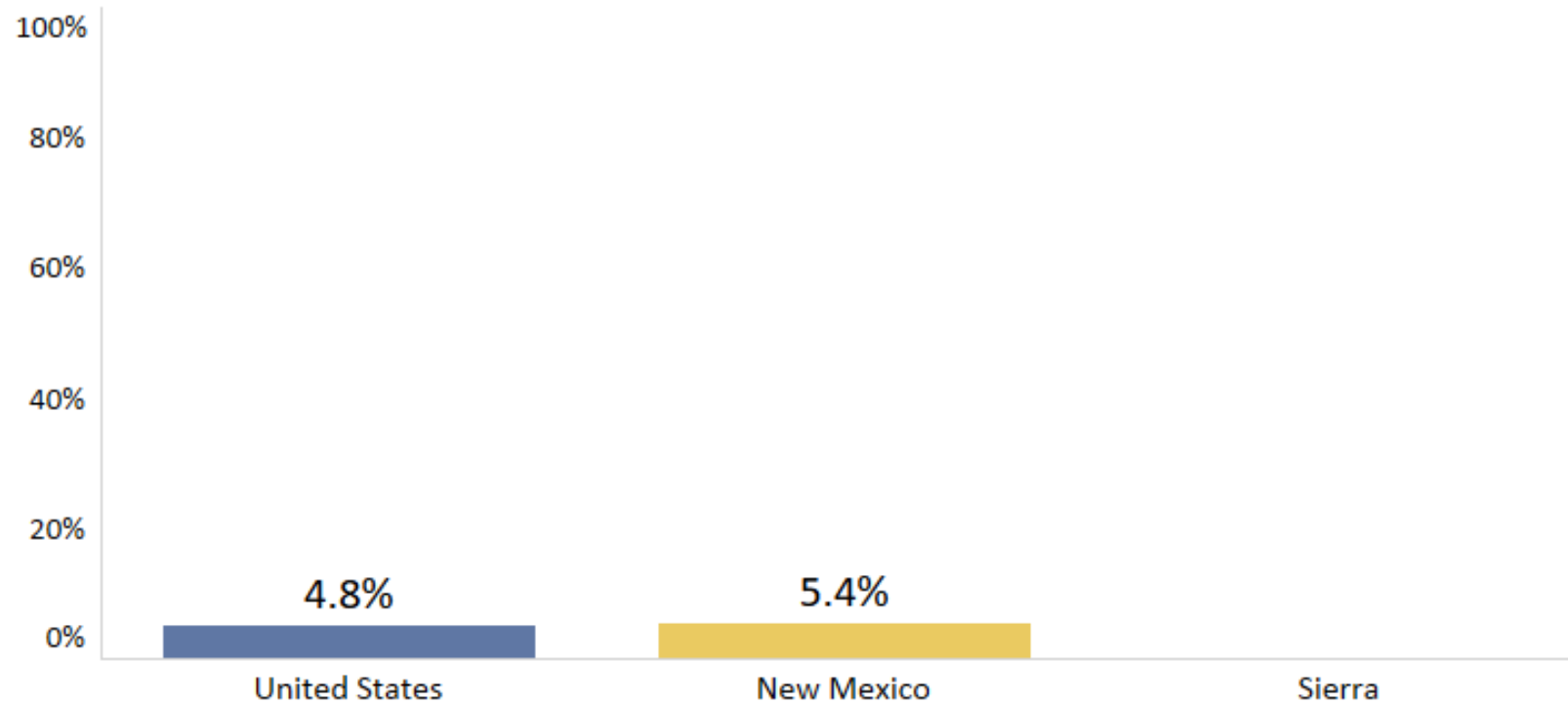


3.8% of babies were born with low or very low birthweight in Sierra

Number of deaths per 1,000 infants, 2016

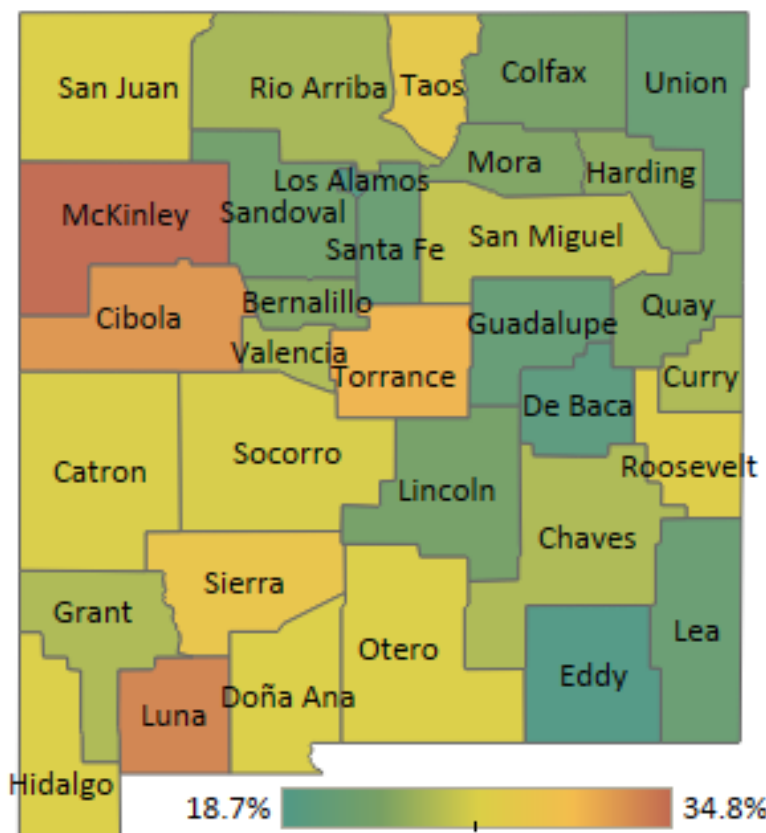

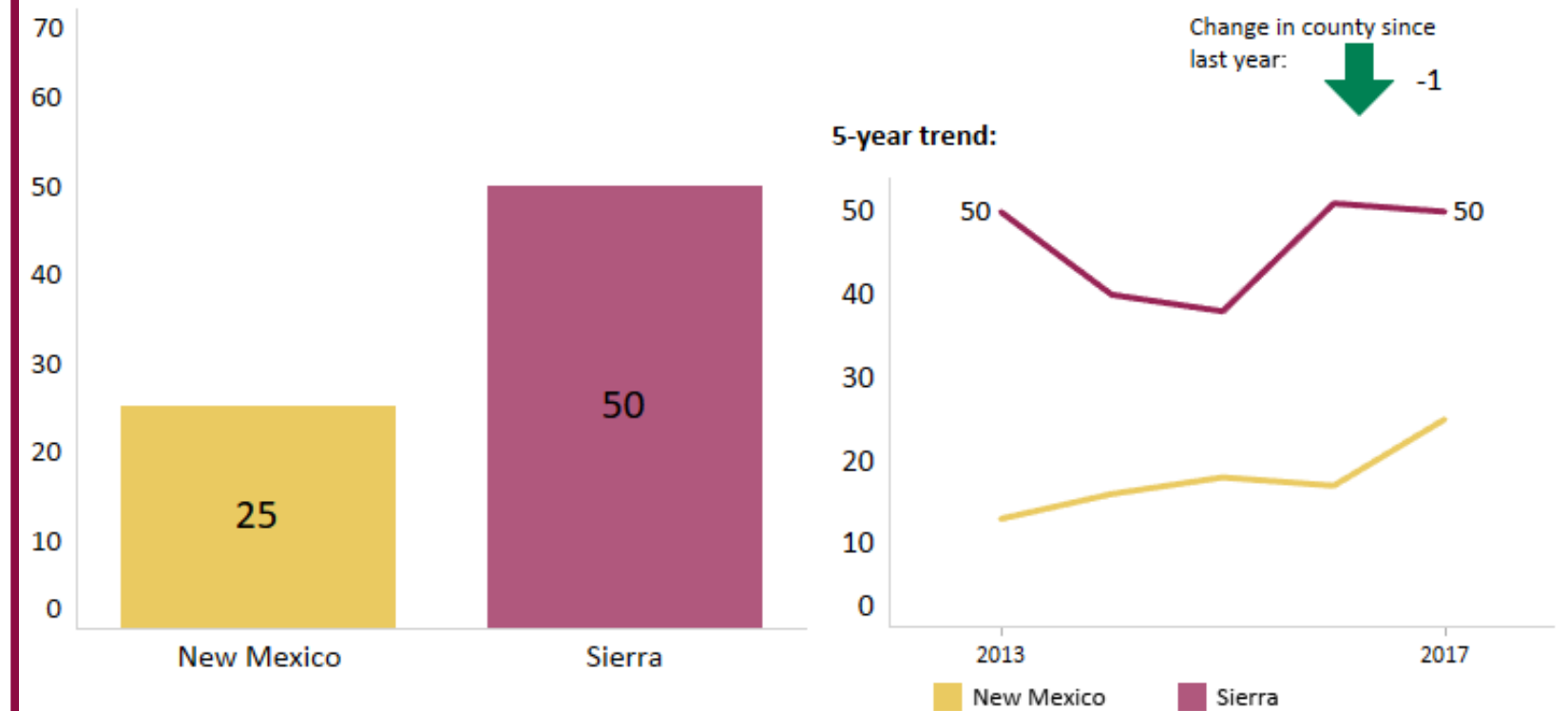

Percent of children under 18 in food insecure homes, 2015

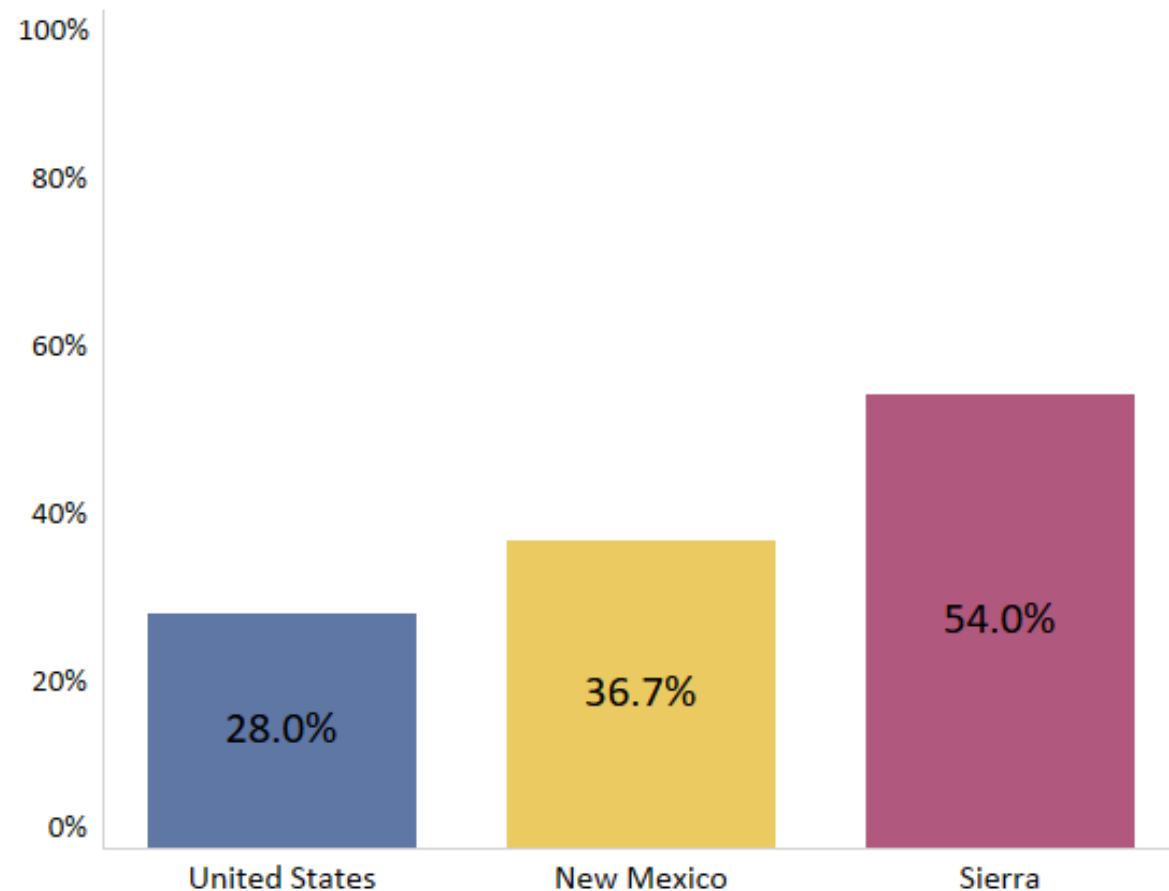


28.9% of children under 18 are in food insecure homes in Sierra

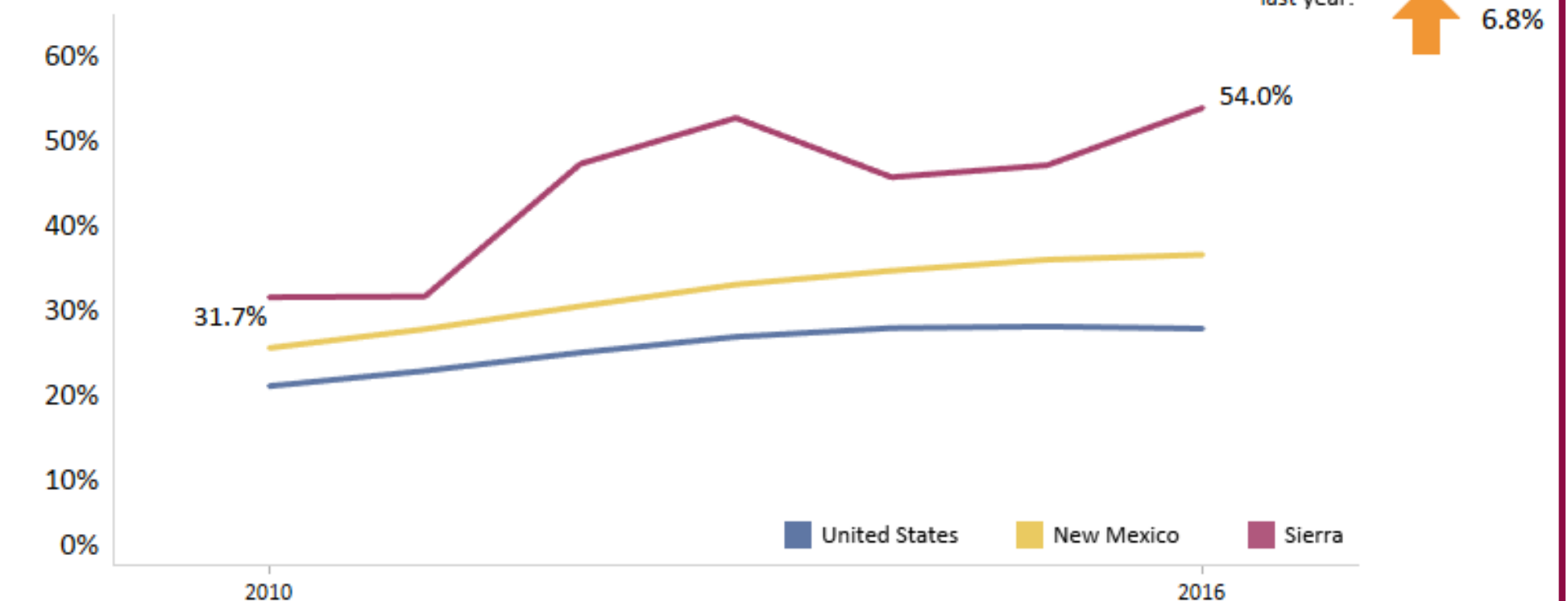
Average number of substantiated child abuse allegations per 1,000 children under 18, 2017
