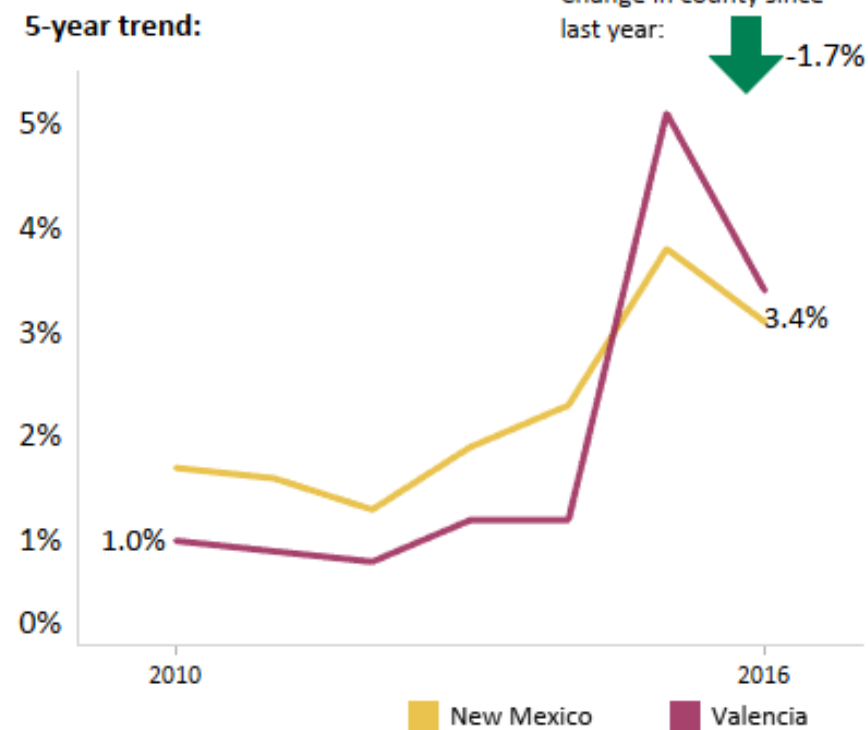
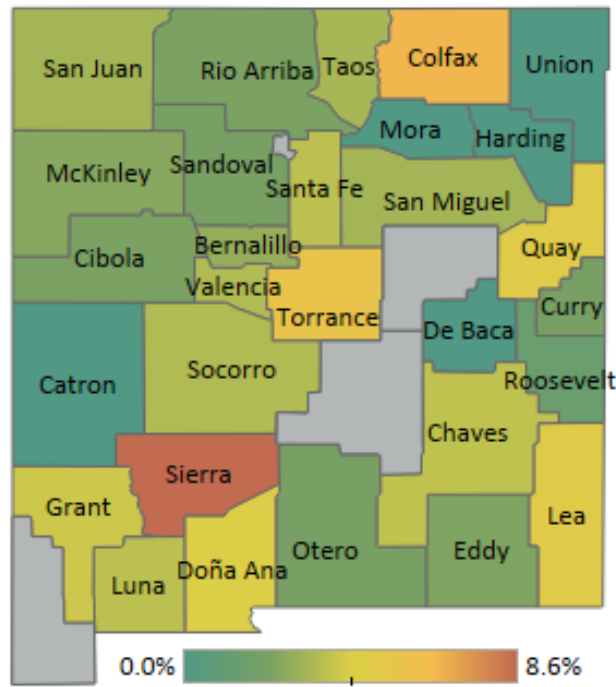

### Percent of mothers who did not receive prenatal care, 2016



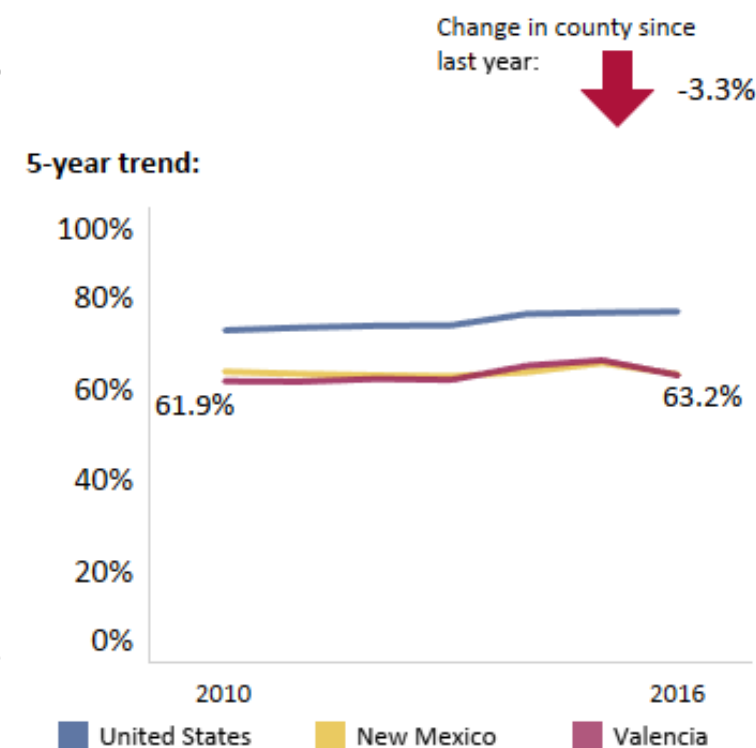
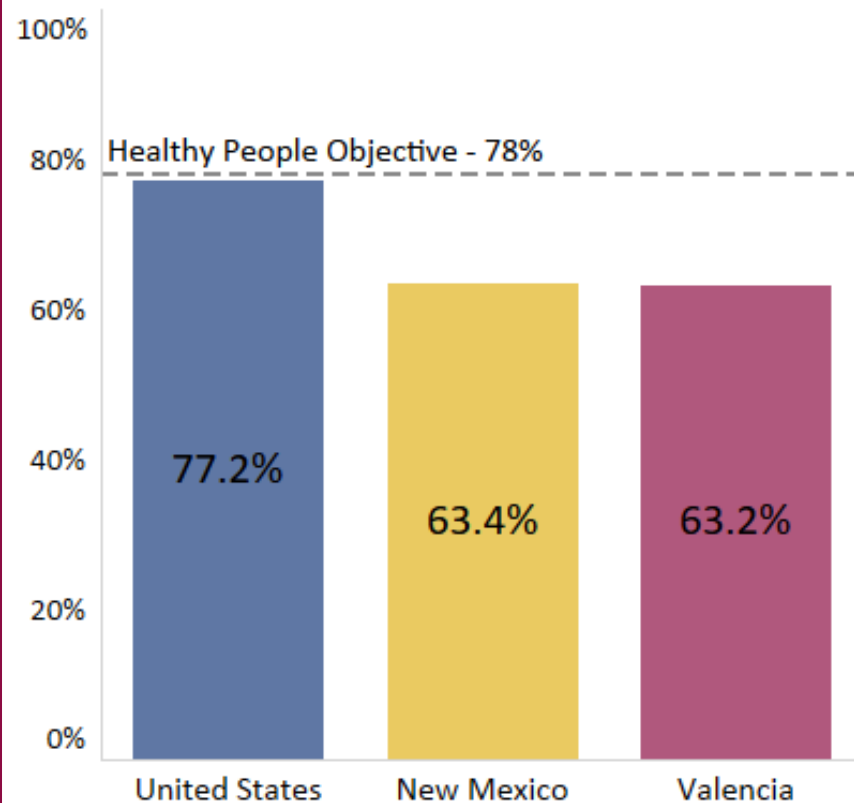
3.4% of mothers did not receive prenatal care during their pregnancy in Valencia

### Birth Rate in Valencia, 2009-2016

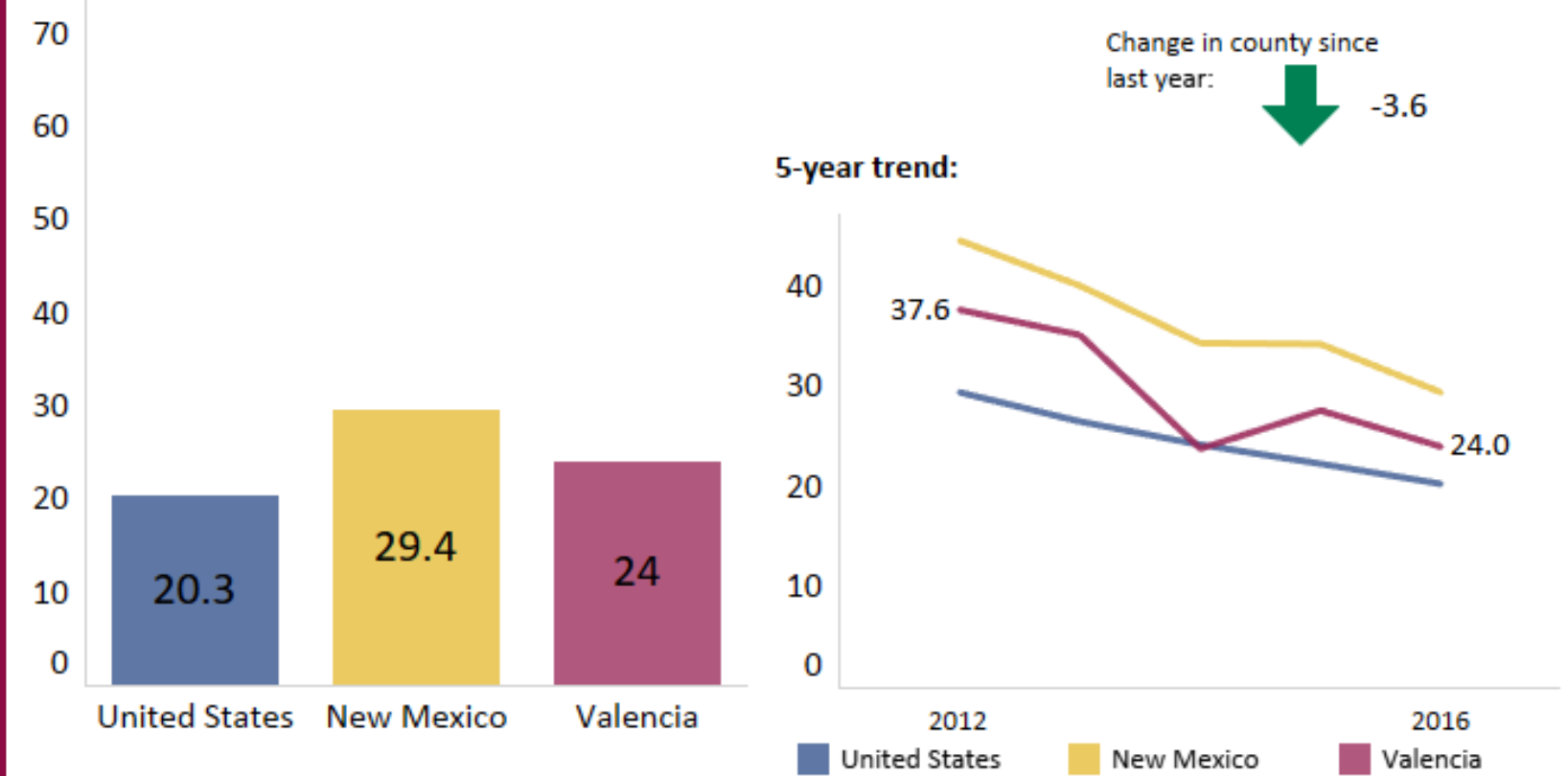


54.0% of mothers 15 to 50 who gave birth in the past 12 months live below 100% of the poverty line in Valencia

### Number of births per 1,000 female teens ages 15-19, 2016

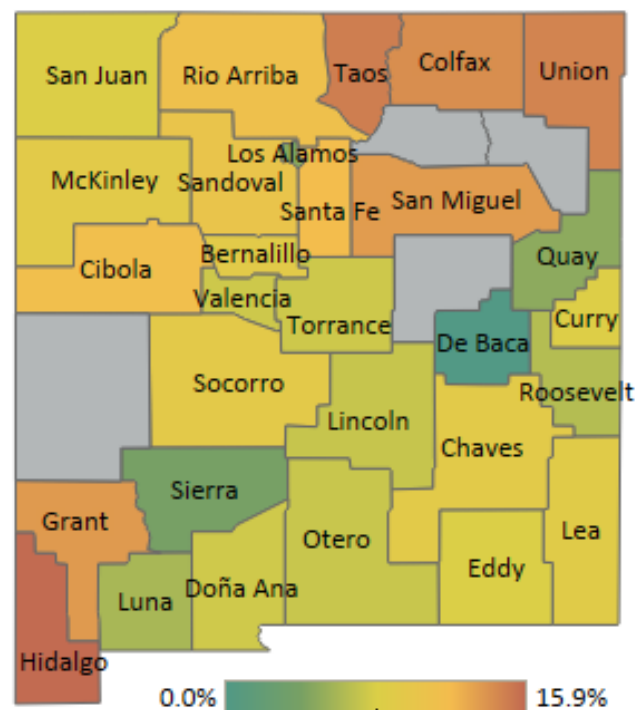

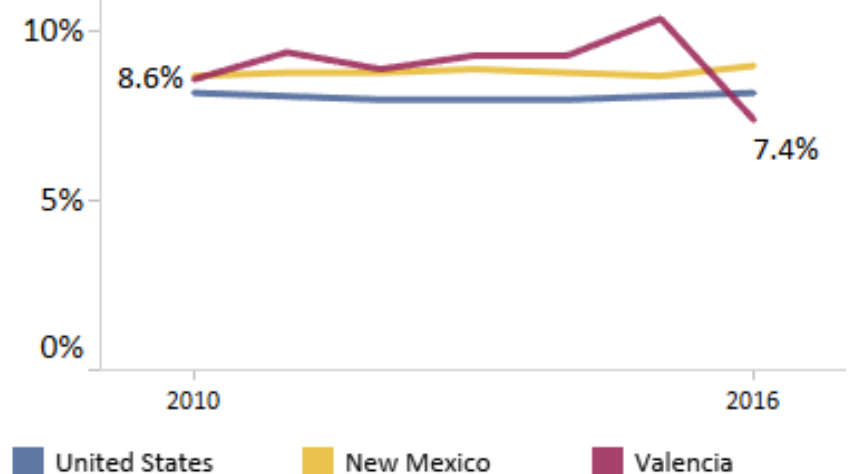

Percent of babies with low or very low birthweight, 2016

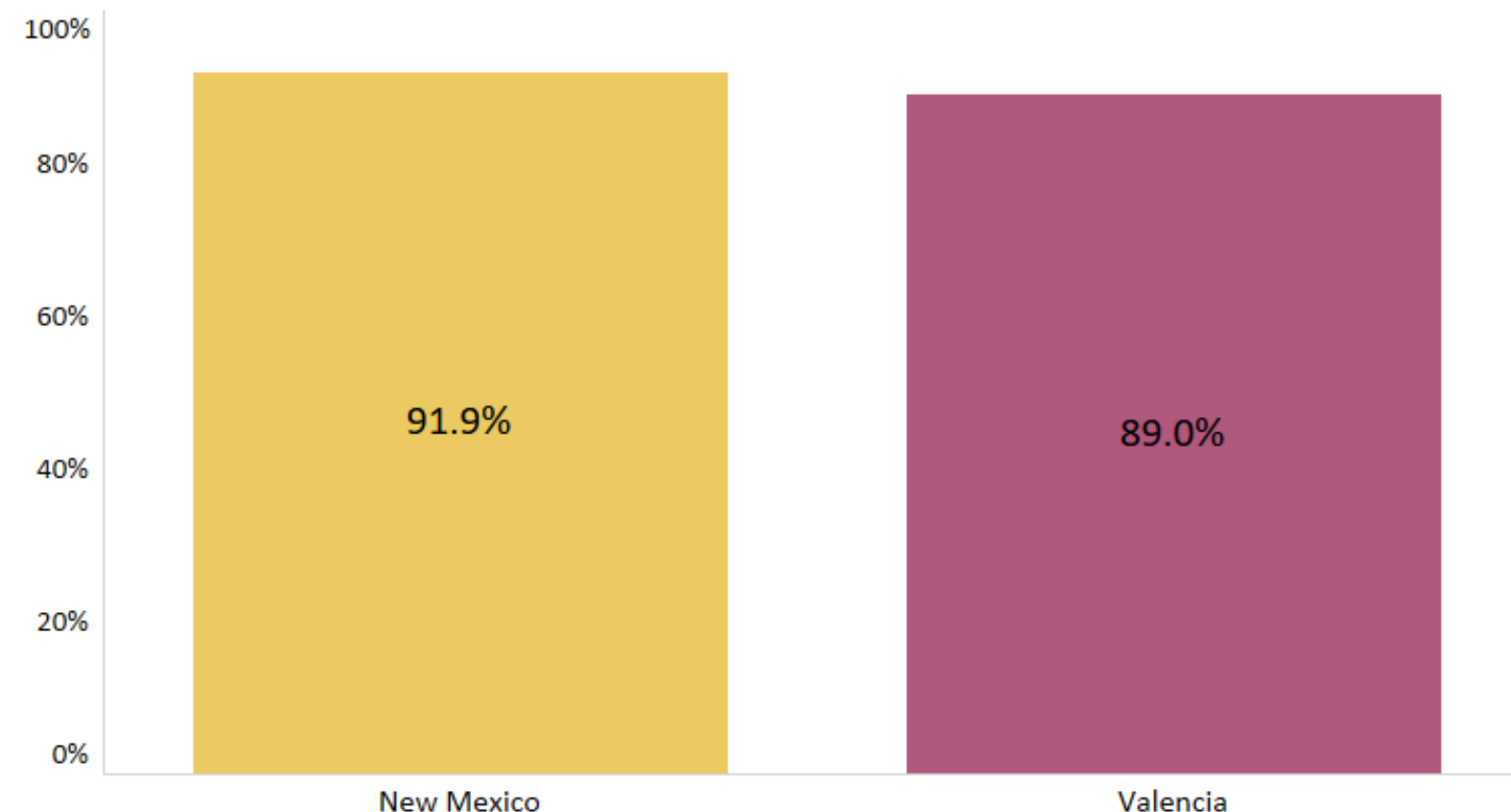

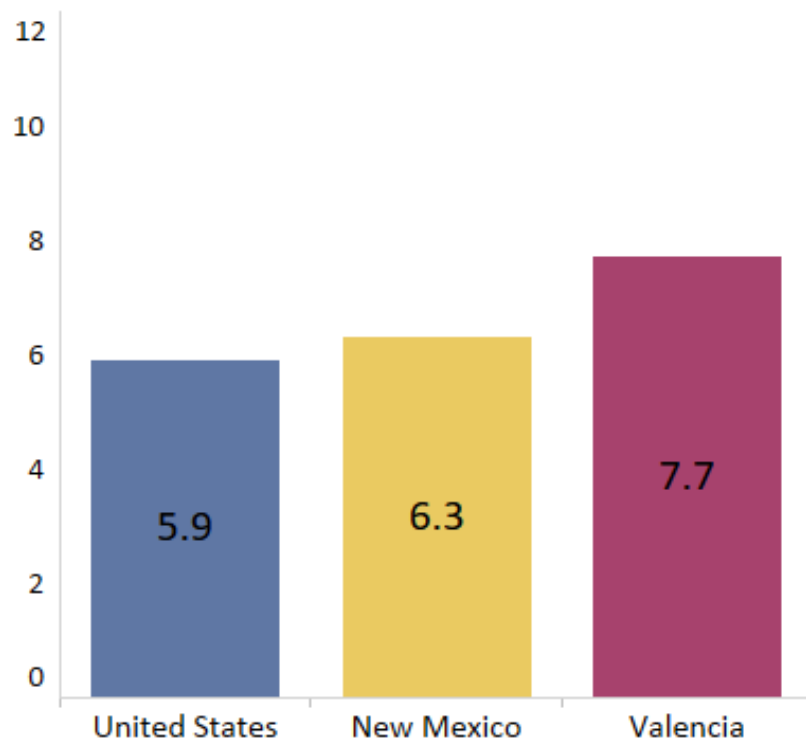

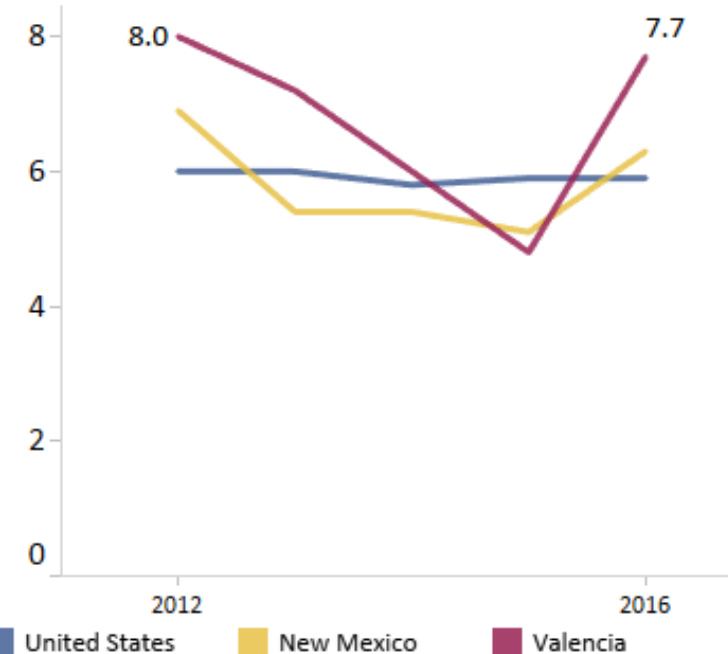
Percent of children 24-35 months who have been immunized by their second birthday, 2016



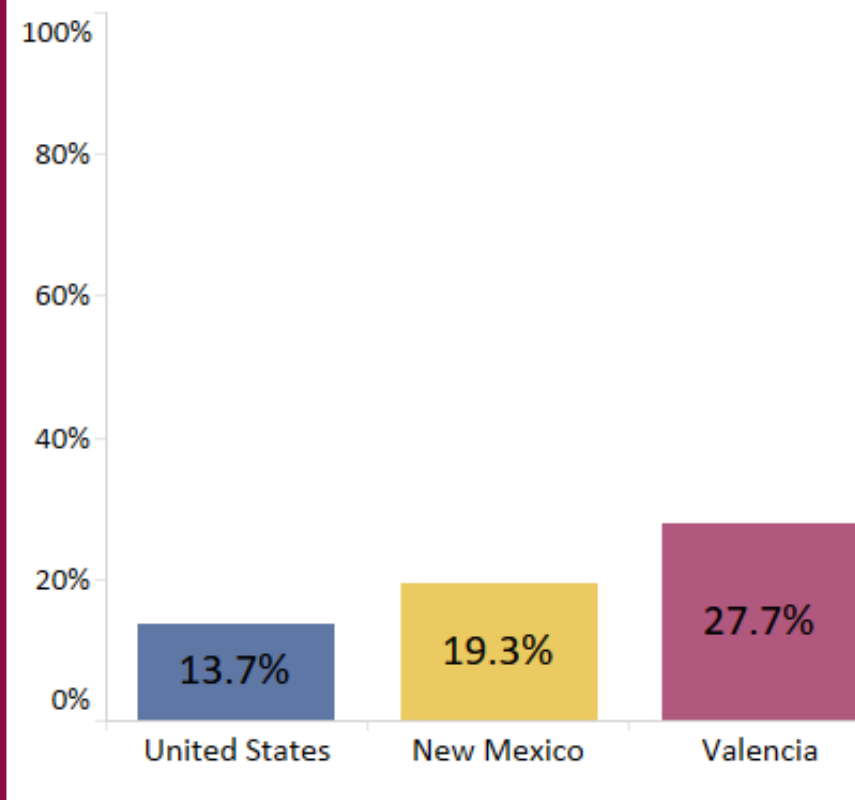
Number of deaths per 1,000 infants, 2016



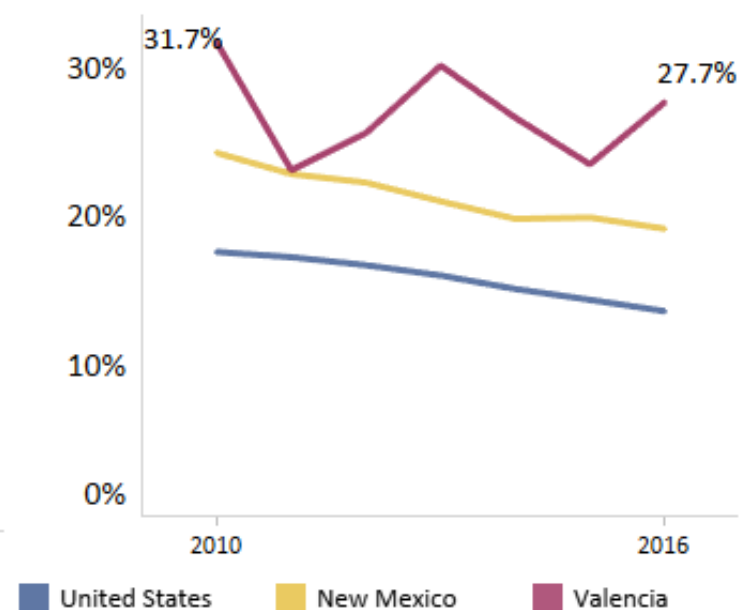

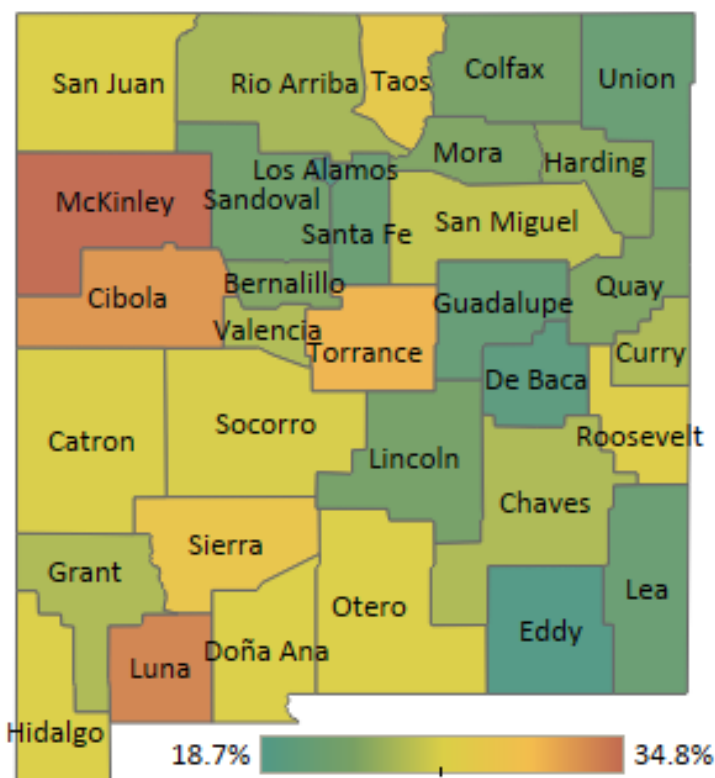

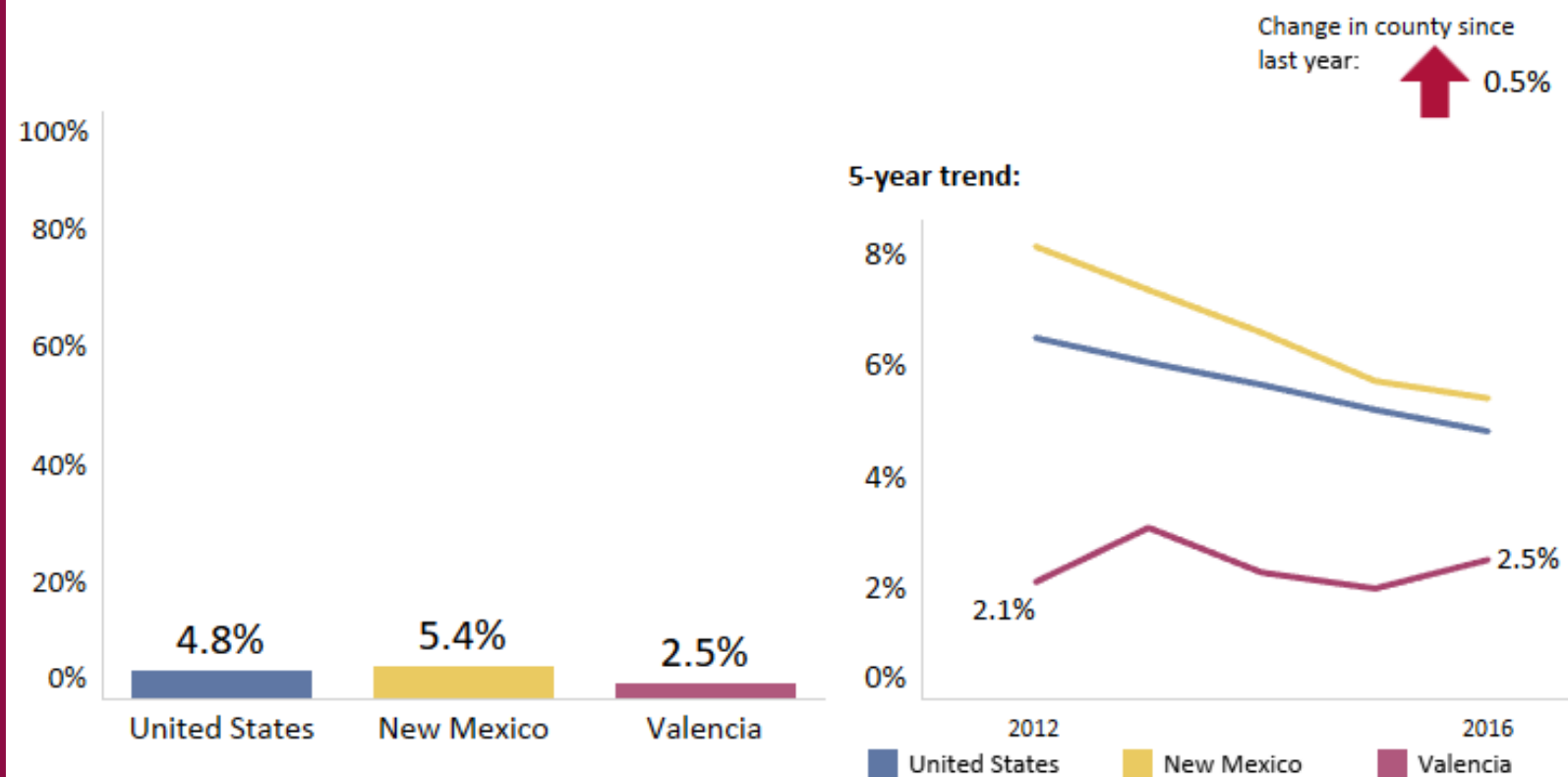

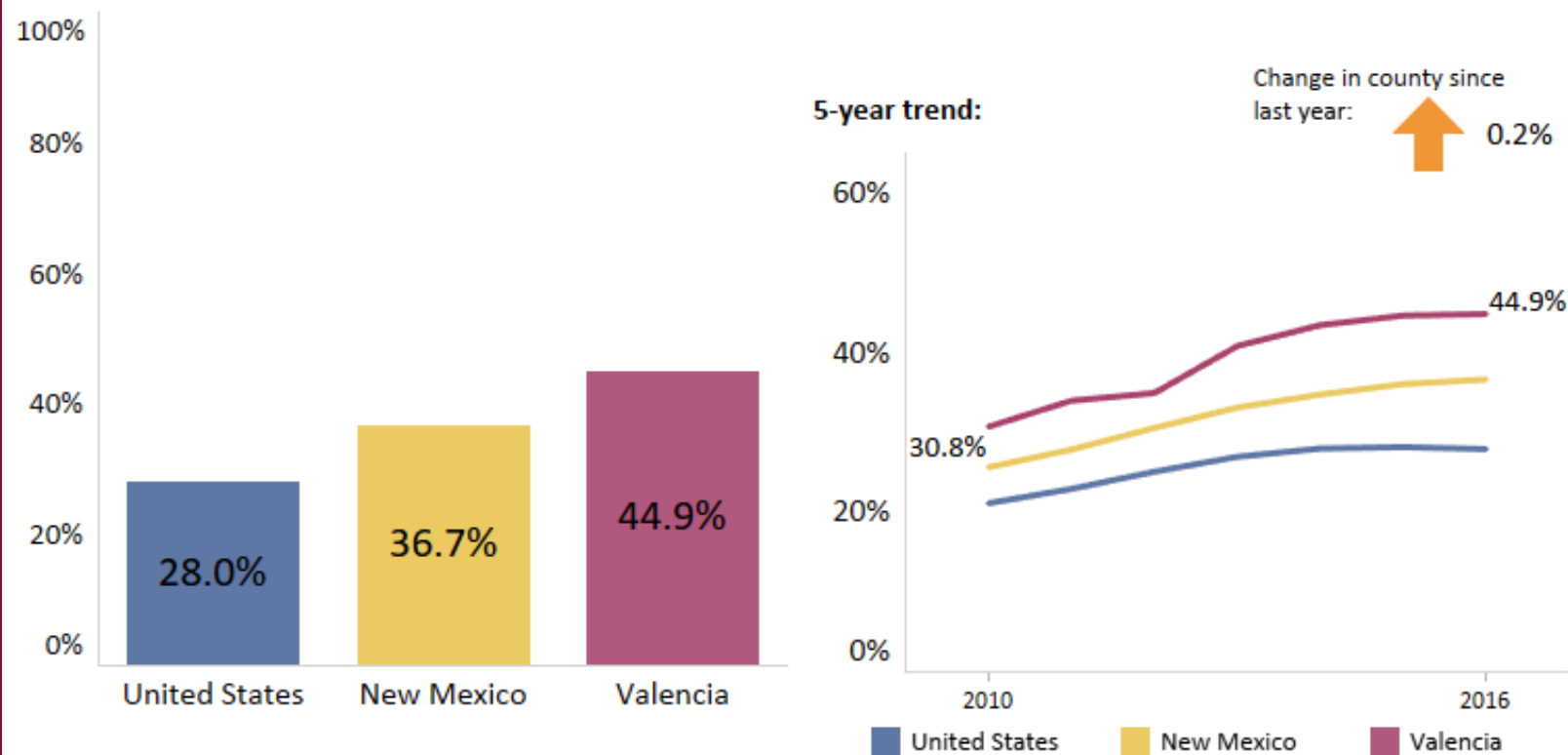
Percent of children under 18 in food insecure homes, 2015



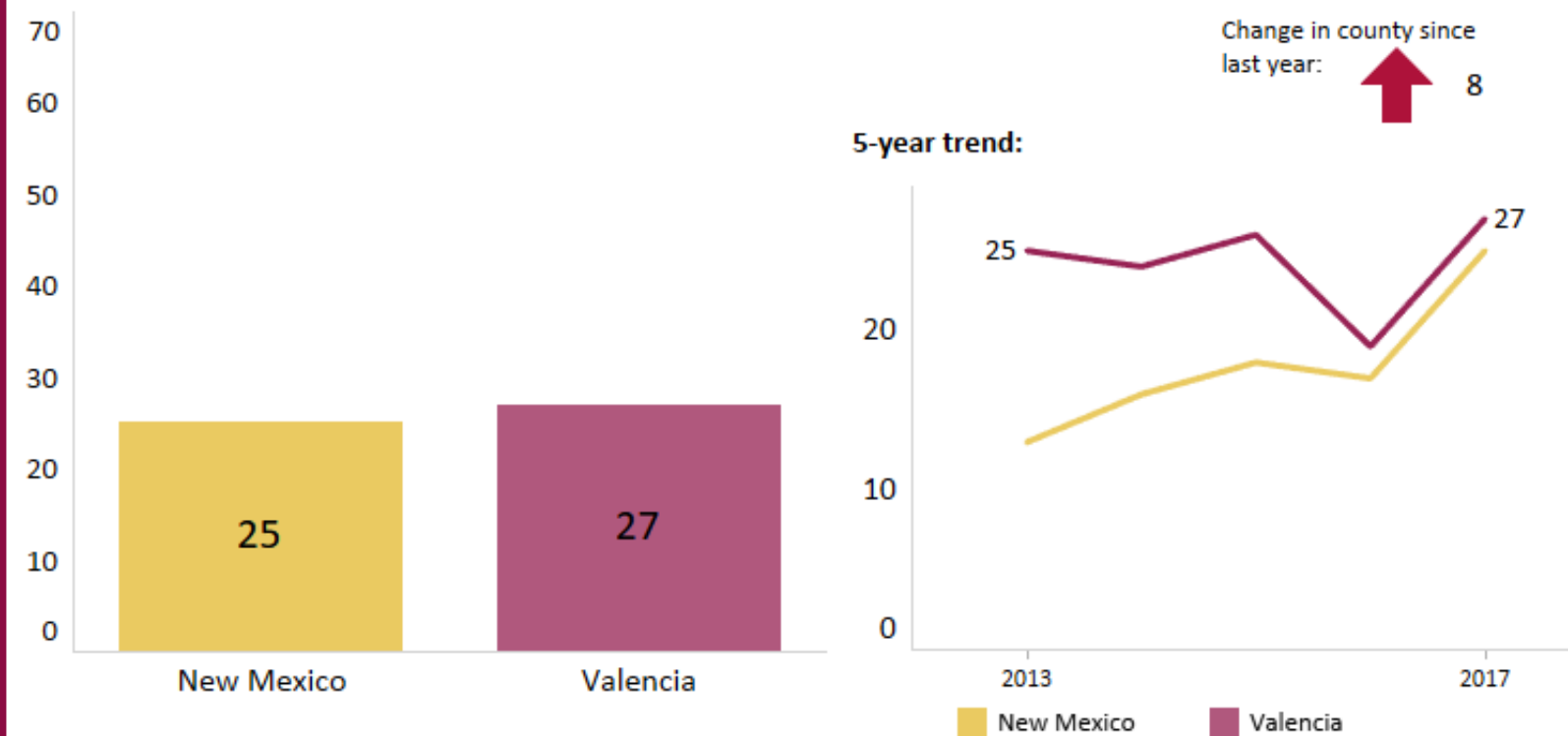
Percent of children without health insurance, 2016
